'The Sweet Hereafter' showing

Amidst the recent Oscar hype, many Canadian film buffs sat watching the awards ceremony with a secret little smile on their faces. They were not feeling smug because Canadian born director James Cameron was about to waltz onstage for a bushel of statuettes, but because a relatively low-budget Canadian film called "The Sweet Hereafter" had made it to the big time, against all odds.

Directed by Atom Egoyan, and starring Sara Polley, the 19-year-old actress best known for her role in the television series "Anne of Avonlea," (who also starred in "Exotica"), the film won raves and the Grand Prix

award at the 1997 Cannes Film Festival. Unfortunately, like many prize-winning, home-grown features, it would never be seen by Canadians living outside the major cities of the country, in spite of its undeniable recognition abroad.

Now, thanks to the efforts of a group of local film enthusiasts who have joined together to create "Reel Alternatives Huntsville," an alternative film society, "The Sweet Hereafter" and other films will be made available on the big screen to Muskoka audiences.

In the film, tragedy unites the residents of a small, British Columbia town. A school bus skids off an icy road and sinks into a frozen lake, taking its

passengers with it. Soon afterwards, a big-city lawyer arrives and stirs up the anger of the townspeople, and it is up to one teenager (played by Polley) to re-unite the community.

In the director's statement, Egoyan declares that "with this film, we go inside."

"In the face of tragedy, we are tested for our fortitude and faith," Egoyan says. "This is the story of a young woman who possesses remarkable courage. She is confronted by a man with all the answers, but not enough questions."

"It is a story about repairing deep wounds to the soul, and the moral choices that have to be made in the process of healing."

Shot against the background of B.C. mountains, the film examines in compassionate detail the daily lives of small-town inhabitants, their interactions, and the sense of commu-
